Teaching Language: Hrvatski

Course Description	Course objectives: Introducing students with the breadth of anthropology as a uniquely comparative and holistic science based on the cross-cultural perspective. Course content: Four-field anthropology: biological (physical) anthropology, cultural (socio-cultural) anthropology, linguistic anthropology and archeology. Applied and medical anthropology. Evolutionary theory and natural selection. Basics of contemporary genetics. Forensic anthropology and identification of remains. Anthropological critique of the race concept. Microevolution and macroevolution. Genetics and origins of modern human. Consequences of domestication, cultivation and sedentism. Anthropological definitions of culture. Ethnographic methods and production of anthropological knowledge. Language, culture and thought. Symbolic practices. Myth and ritual. Kinship. Social inequality, race and ethnicity: implications for health and well-being. Cultural processes in a global world.
